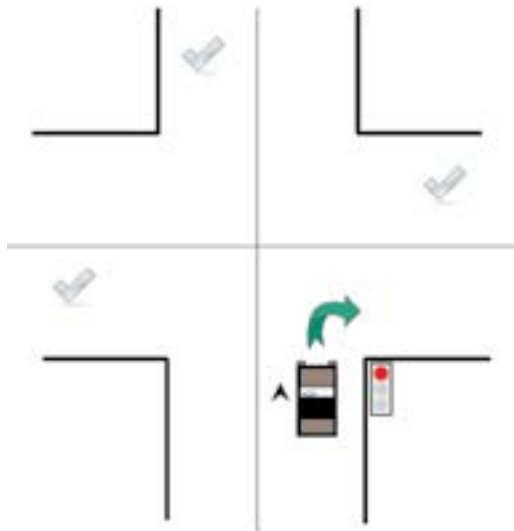

A few special factors must be considered before attempting to make a right turn on red:

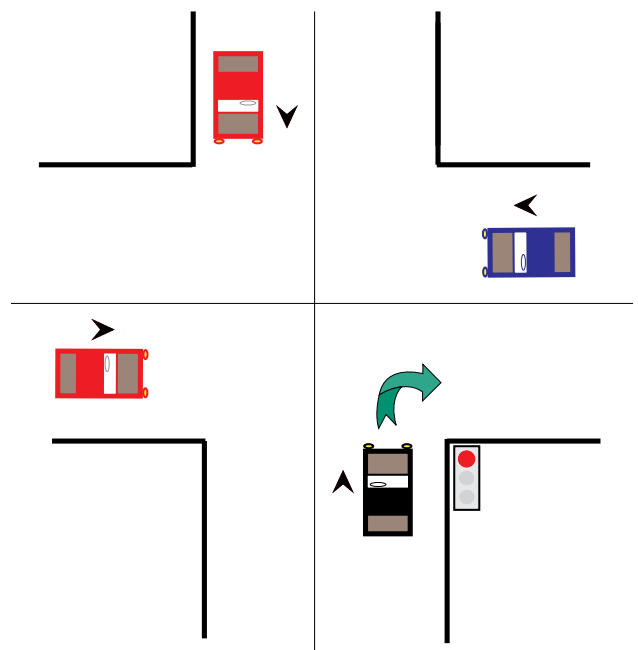
- **Right of Way.** All traffic legally in the intersection ahead has right of way over you as you.
- **Pedestrians.** Be alert for pedestrians who may attempt to cross one of the streets at the intersection. Pedestrians always have the right of way once they are in the roadway and as a driver it is your responsibility to avoid them. Since your vehicle is facing a red light, it becomes more likely that a pedestrian may cross in front of you.
- **Crossing Traffic.** You must look both ways before attempting a right turn on red to evaluate the crossing traffic. Carefully judge speed and distance of other cars, especially those approaching from your left. Also watch out for possible U-Turns being made by traffic approaching from your right as those vehicles have the right of way.
- **Oncoming Traffic.** You must carefully consider whether any vehicle in the oncoming traffic may turn left in front of you. Remember, even though you are facing a red light, the oncoming traffic may have a green signal (or arrow) giving them the right of way if they choose to turn left in front of you.
